

Newark airport features 3D art film about the city by local documentarians

The open house for "New Work: Newark" in 3D" has been postponed until Friday, Jan. 10 due to snow predictions; RSVP deadline is now Friday, Jan. 3.

We normally wouldn't take note of the opening of an art gallery in Newark Liberty Airport. Except this one is being inaugurated with a 6-minute, 3D black-and-white art film celebrating the city of Newark that was created by a pair of Emmy-nominated Newark filmmakers with a knack for mining local stories.

"New Work: Newark in 3-D," by husband-and wife filmmakers Marylou and Jerome Bongiorno, was inspired by Manhatta, America's first avant-garde film, and will be exhibited through Jan 10 in two areas of Terminal B: a specially designed screening gallery for international passengers and in the Relax and Recharge Lounge for all visitors. In addition, the film's

trailer is being shown on the Welcome Center Monitors in all terminals.

An open house for the exhibit is set for Friday, Jan. 3 Jan 10 at 2 p.m. in the Terminal B

gallery. If you're interested in attending, you'll need to undergo a security screening and you must submit your name and birthdate by Friday, Jan. 3 today Friday, Dec. 27 to bonpix@verizon.net.
