Having flight delays? Newark Airport is making it a little easier to be engaged and inspired with a 6minute short 3D art film that is on view through January 15th.

It was inspired by Charles Sheeler and Paul Strand's 1921 avant-garde film <u>"Manhatta" (http://www.getty.edu/art/gettyguide/videoDetails?segid=3516) (</u>with intertitles from Walt Whitman) and features black-and-white images of Newark shot from unusual vantage points, including the roof of the airport, unfurling against a soundtrack of spoken-word poetry and music by artists based in Newark."
