The New Jersey Historical Commission has announced its 2013 Award Winners. Dr. Michael Rockland has received the Richard J. Hughes Award for lifetime achievement and contributions to New Jersey history; and author and journalist Holly Metz is the recipient of the Richard P. McCormick Prize for her book, *Killing the Poormaster: A Saga of Poverty, Corruption, and Murder in the Great Depression.*
